**Keel Model # 1694**. Fully race equipped with sails used approximately 6 times. Vang, pole up/down, internal outhaul, jib tension, cunningham, jib drop assist are all on cam cleats mounted on a bar under the cuddy. Adjustable backstay and aft-mounted traveler controls led under the deck to cam cleats on the port & starboard combing. Spinnaker sheets led under deck to Harken cam cleats. Mainsheet led to a barney post in center of cockpit floor. "Twing" controls led under deck. Lindsay rudder, mast mounted and deck mounted compasses, second set of sails and a custom trailer.
